CR3, I'm beginning to understand their point of view.

Years ago I regularly raced off-road, and recall with great joy the moment I first rode a full titanium mountain bike. At the time I swore I'd be happy never to ride anything else ever again. With the arrival of the Merlin, the first full titanium road bike I've ever ridden, I'm beginning to feel the same way.

Straight out of the box, and with no adjustment other than saddle height, all the reasons why titanium is so highly prized hit you squarely on the chin. Light weight, amazing stiffness, quick response, and unparalleled comfort all combine in a perfectly-balanced package. OK, other frame materials might be able to match or sometimes

Add to that the fact that titanium bikes always, but always, have a classy, understated look and will never fall apart, rust away or come unglued, and you can see why such a high proportion of riders who use them swear by them religiously.

A first glance over this particular Merlin reveals tight compact geometry with a sloping top tube and hourglass stays. The build quality synonymous with Merlin throughout the years is evident

all over it and the graphics have been updated, including a classy, engraved head tube badge. The build is mostly Ultegra with some Cane Creek headset parts and 'Real Design' Super Sphere wheels. I might upgrade the wheels purely for cosmetic reasons: although they perform really well, they look a little too 'traditional' on this bike, so I might experiment a bit. It's tricky, though, as the front end response is already amazing and I don't want to lose that. There's a pair of Mantis Wing Shape bars on the front, which I love and are definitely staying on there.

Now all I need do is get over my paranoia of riding it regularly and getting it dirty - either that or it's a move to Belsize Park and a sad life of weekend polishing for me.
